Weighted average arrow score calculated as follows:

- > Total Score divided by # of Shots gives Avg Arrow Score result
- > Multiply tournament's Avg Arrow Score by Tournament Weight for Score Weight
- > Sum all Score Weights (ignoring zeros)
- > Sum all Tournament Weights (ignoring zeros)
- > Divide Sum of Score Weights by Sum of Tournament Weights

Adjustments*

- > Bonus points may be added to arrow score based on podium position at tournament, or to balance tournament difficulty.
- > Including rank/podium position is optional.
- > Podium bonus points, and adjustments to tournament weights will be applied evenly to applicants with the same tournaments.
- > Club tournament weights may be adjusted in to balance difficulty, level of competition, or alternative formats.
- > This system will not be used to deliberately exclude applicants, but may be of use when comparing similar results.
- > The intent is to encourage applicants to include scores from tournaments they might have omitted when scores were low, such as when weather conditions were severe, or when courses were particularly challenging in ways that impacted all participants.
